IPA: Other symbols used in transcription of English pronunciation	
IPA	Explanation
ˈ	Primary stress (placed before the stressed syllable), for example <i>rapping</i> /ˈræpɪŋ/
ˌ	Secondary stress, for example <i>battleship</i> /ˌbætəlˌʃɪp/
.	Syllable separator, for example <i>plankton</i> /ˈplæŋk.tən/
̩	Syllabic consonant, for example <i>ridden</i> /ˈɪdɪ̩n/
